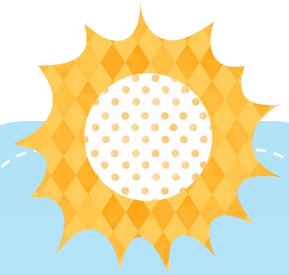

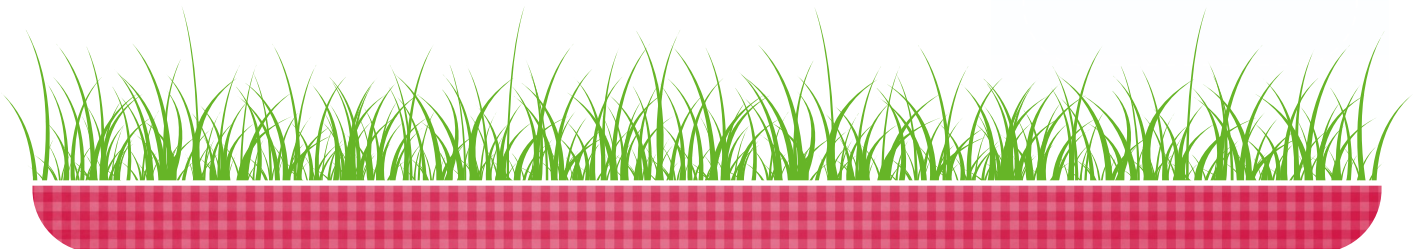


Our Family, Our Veterans

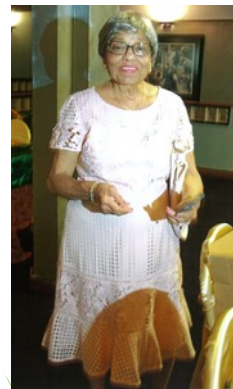


I last saw them when they traveled to Maryland last June to attend Jim's homegoing service.

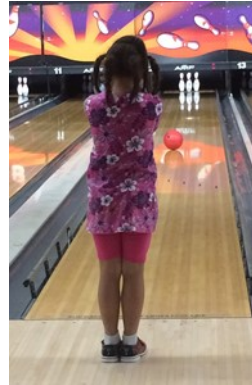


Did you know?

Dynasty works full time at Victory World Church as the head of the middle school music ministry and the Executive Assistant for the middle school pastors.

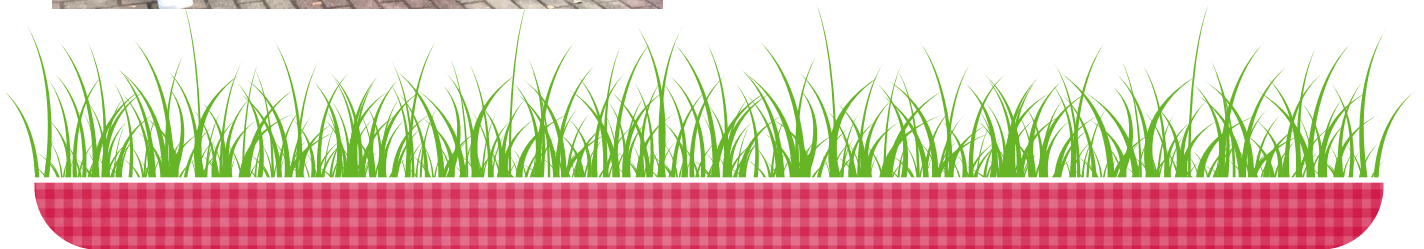


John & Jasmine (Clark) Riggins Family

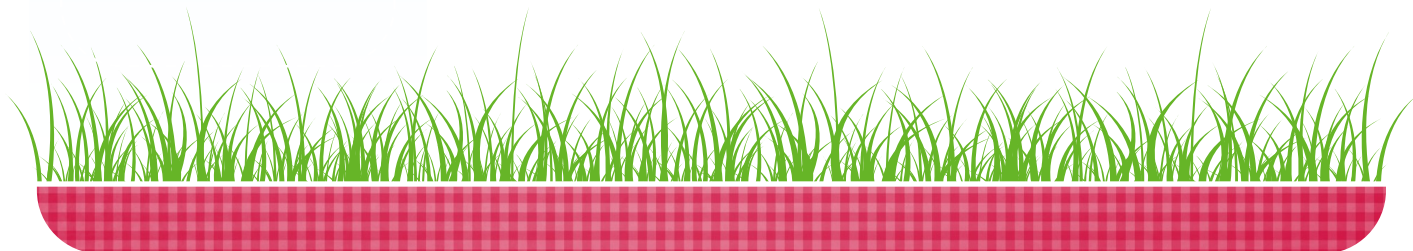

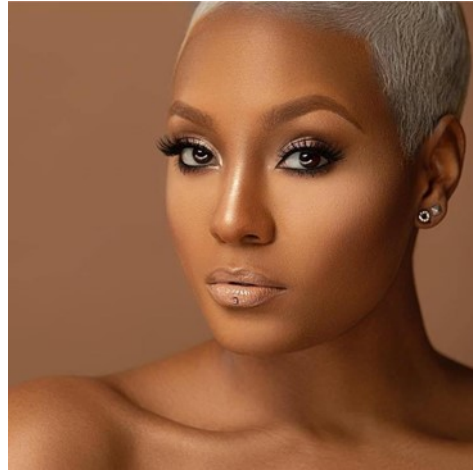

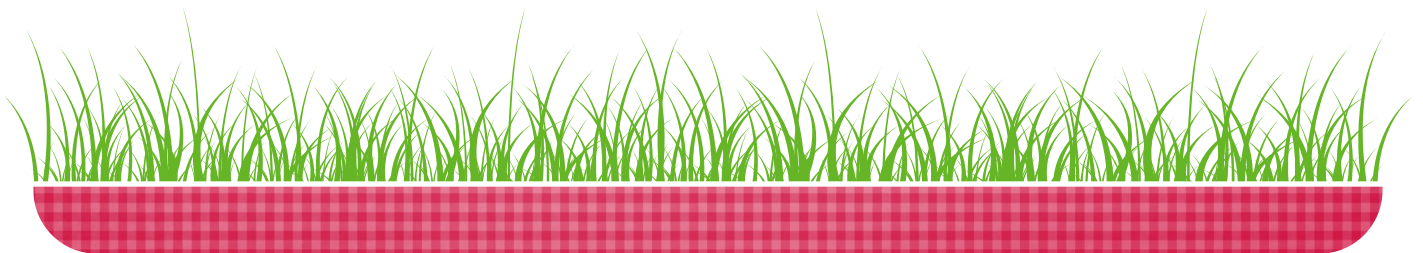


Mary (Cobb) Heath Family

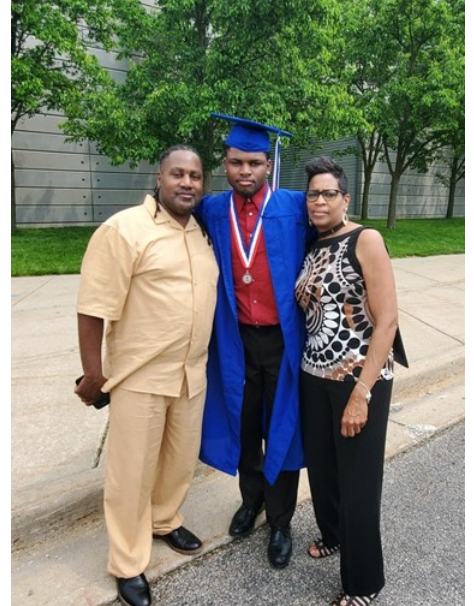

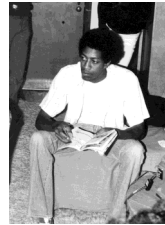


Kenneth Cobb

Since stepping down as Hugely Reunion President (2014-18) last August, Kenneth has continued to thoroughly enjoy even more free time by distributing his fun-filled activities between NYC/local Jazz concerts, Black Theatre performances, independent films, writing, tutoring, volunteering, and visiting with Aunt Alice's wonderful friends (the 'Usual Suspects'). On pace to take in 129 performances (e.g., plays, musicals, dance, ballet, choirs) this 2018-19 theatrical season (September-August), he frequently invites Aunt Alice to join him, thereby, 'liberating' her of from self-imposed and ever-expansive house chores. These 129 performances do not include the dozen or so children's plays that he treats his 7-year-old niece/cousin Carrington Viot to as part of "Fun Saturdays" (e.g., bowling, Sky Zone, Monster Mini Golf, movies, Dunkin' Donuts, Pizza Hut, McDonald's). Truth is, Kenneth enjoys the children plays (and casting diversity) MORE than Carrington does and she provides him adequate cover!!! 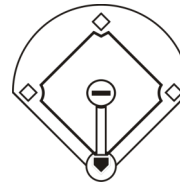

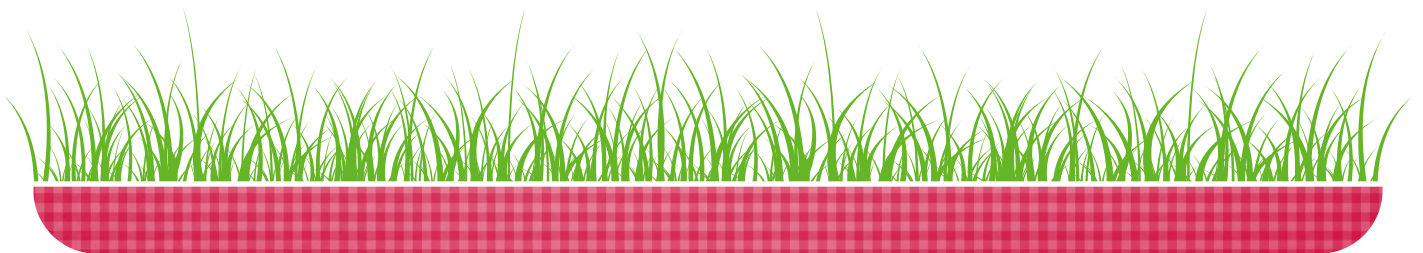

On the Jazz front, Kenneth is happy to report the recent opening of a new Jazz venue in downtown Baltimore's Inner Harbor East, Keystone Korner Baltimore, an elegant facility on the level of prominent and historical NYC Jazz clubs, including the Village Vanguard, Blue Note, Birdland, Dizzy's Club Coca-Cola @ JALC (Jazz at Lincoln Center), and Jazz Standard, as far as bringing in big-name NYC straightahead Jazz artists, as well as its ambiance and appearance. Its co-owner, NEA (National Endowment for the Arts) Jazz Master record producer

operated the famous and historic Keystone Korner in San Francisco, CA, during 1972-83, as well as served as Director for Dizzy's @ JALC from 2000-12. During these days of very few profitable and sustainable Jazz clubs outside of NYC, Kenneth personally vows to do his part to make sure that Keystone Korner Baltimore survives financially... Always a huge advocate for education of our young folks, Kenneth took great pride (and a financial hit!) this June in celebrating the high school graduations of five special family members and children of good friends, all of whom Kenneth is extremely proud, is inexorably connected, and played a small role in their respective success :v):

Dante, headed to Saginaw Valley State University (MI) (frequent Chez Barthwell patron); Miya, headed to Hampton University (VA) (travel agent - twice); Jason, headed to University of Pennsylvania (Huguely Newsletter publicist); Derrick, headed to the University of Maryland (math tutor); and Da'Jon, headed to Auguste Escoffier School of Culinary Arts (TX) (new (rental) car legend). Charley and Del are extremely busy as they are involved in many community activities.

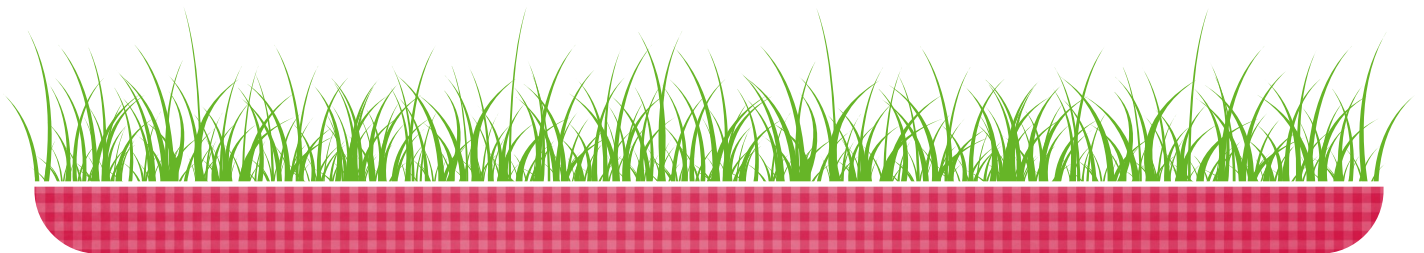


Charley and Del spend time together at Osceola Heritage Stadium, Kissimmee, Florida, enjoying a Fire Frogs Baseball game.

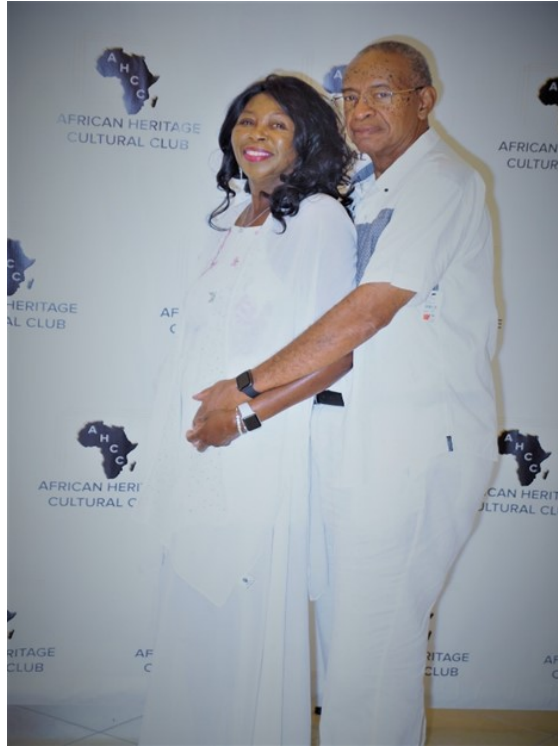

Charley and Del ready for the African Heritage Cultural Club Annual White Dance 2019.

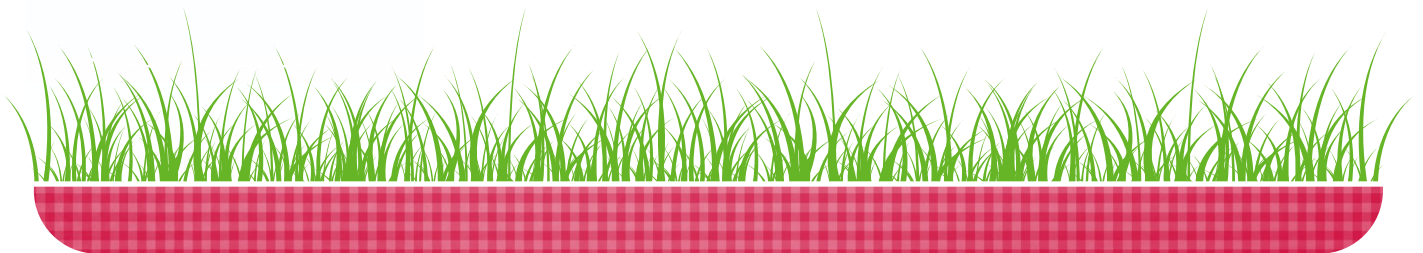

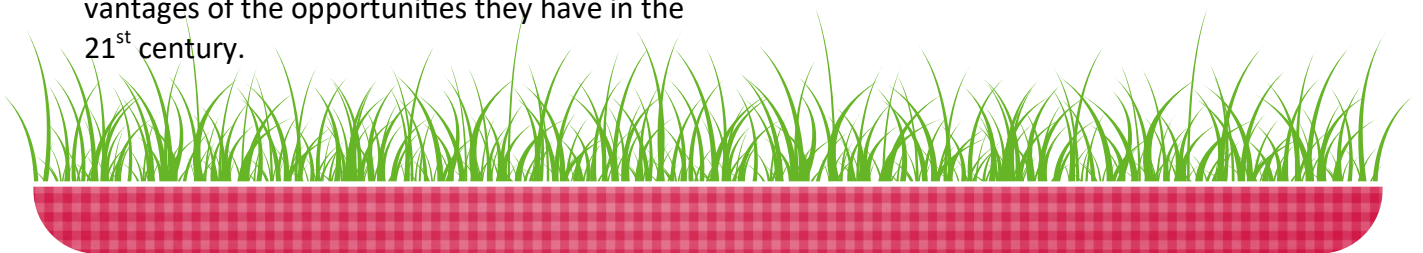

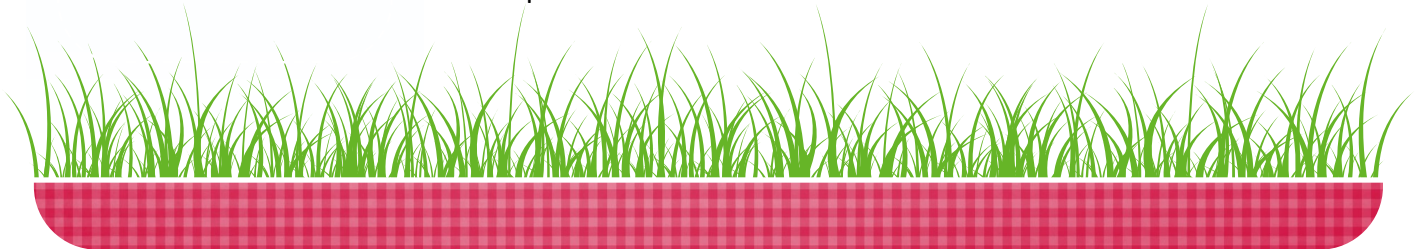
Adel and Chris enjoy a seafood meal in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

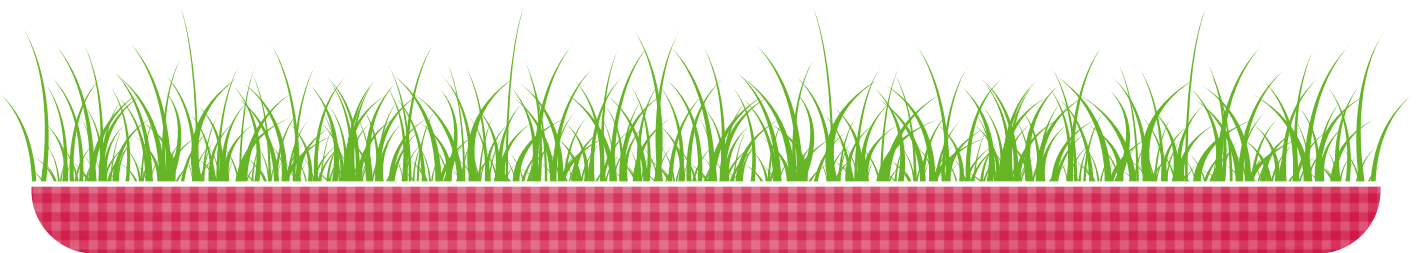

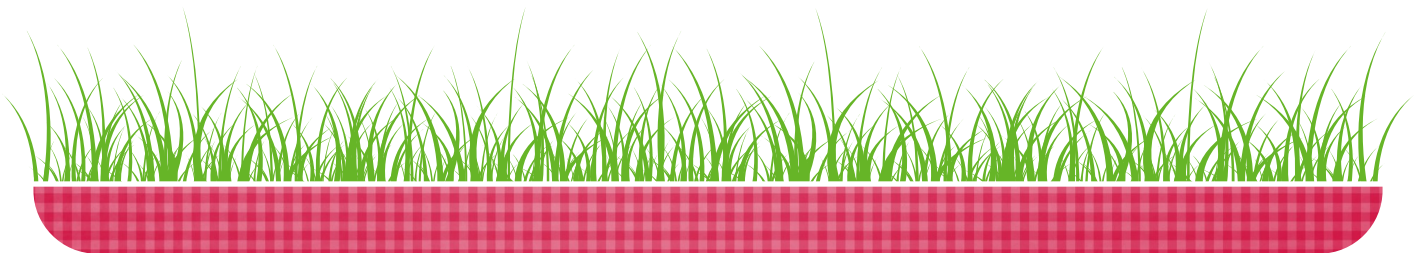
Jason Cornelison

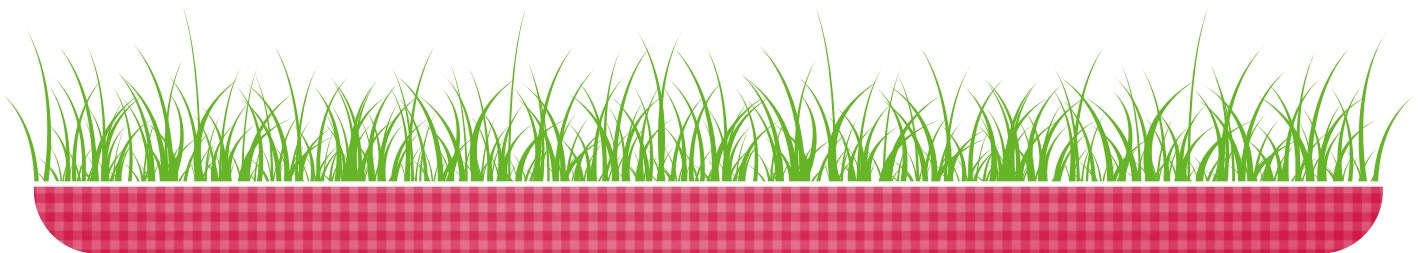
Korrie Harris

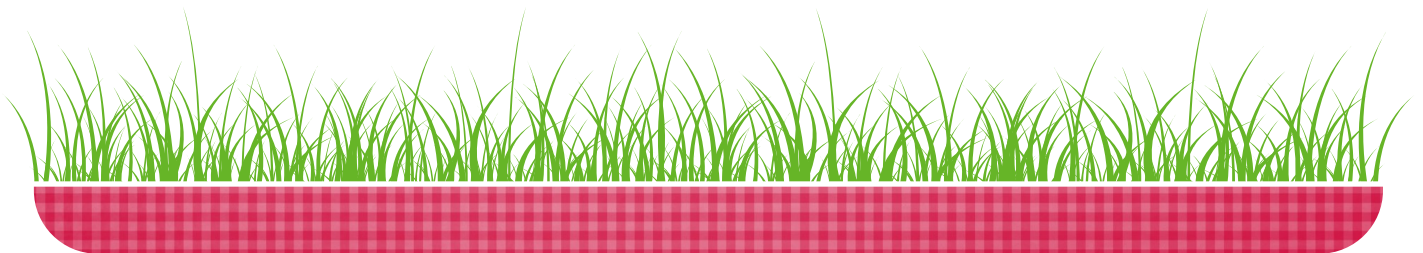
Dear Huguely Family,
